PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project involved improving sidewalks and transit access through a busy corridor in the Canal neighborhood. New bike lanes, widened sidewalks, improved bus stops, and new street furniture were installed while overhead utilities were undergrounded at the same time.

POINTS OF INTEREST

The Canal has one of the highest rates of transit usage in the county and Medway Road serves as a primary route for Marin Transit buses in addition to being the main route for cyclists in the neighborhood to get to downtown San Rafael.

STATUS
