PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will study the feasibility of connecting the existing Mill Valley-Sausalito Pathway at Gate 6 Road/Bridgeway to the Sausalito Ferry Terminal via an off-street Class I multi-use pathway. The study will identify a preferred alternative for making this critical connection in the North-South Bikeway as an alternative to the existing Class II bicycle lanes on Bridgeway Avenue. The project follows on the update of the Sausalito Bicycle Plan Update (2008) and the ongoing Imagine Sausalito process, both of which have identified an off street multi-use facility as a priority for connecting north-south through Sausalito.

STATUS

The City of Sausalito, with assistance from a consulting team, started work on this project in June 2009. To date there have been three Technical Advisory Committee (TAC) meetings including a walking tour of the project corridor. The TAC is currently reviewing the project's existing conditions as well as opportunities and constraints for a bicycle and pedestrian path that extends from the Gate 6 Road/Bridgeway intersection at the southern terminus of the Mill Valley-Sausalito Path to the Sausalito Ferry Terminal. This spring, the City hopes to share draft cross-sections and a proposed alignment to the TAC and then hold an open house to share these concepts with the general public.
