## LOCATION

Doherty Drive between Magnolia Avenue and Riviera Circle West (Larkspur)

## COST

\$750,000 (estimated)

## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

This project will provide a Class I path along the south side of Doherty Drive to connect Magnolia Avenue and downtown Larkspur with three schools (of approximately 2,100 students total) and residential neighborhoods. A bridge over Baltimore Creek is included in the project.

## POINTS OF INTEREST

The path will provide safe access along Doherty Drive, a heavily traveled roadway, to Hall Middle School, Redwood High School, Tamiscal Continuation School, and Piper Park. It will also improve access to downtown for residents of the Riviera and Larkspur Boardwalk, as well as future development of the Niven site.

## STATUS

Project design is under way. Needed right-of-way acquired from school district.

## ABOUT WALKBIKEMARIN

WalkBikeMarin is an initiative by the County of Marin to help make Marin more healthy, livable, and environmentally sustainable by encouraging walking and bicycling as everyday transportation. This initiative was catalyzed by a recent \$25 million federal grant to fund the Nonmotorized Transportation Pilot Program (NTPP).

Revision Date: 12/09

The multi-use pathway will provide an improved connection between downtown, Redwood High School, and the Riviera neighborhood. It will replace the narrow sidewalk now in place.
