## PROJECT DESCRIPTION

The project funds various step, lane, and path projects in four communities. Many of Marin's older hillside neighborhoods were laid out with roads following the contours of the hill with narrow passages designated going between blocks between streets. Some provided access to train stations while others served to provide access to commercial areas. Where driving can be circuitous at best, these passages provide direct connections for pedestrians. Some of these passages were constructed but are in disrepair while others were never built but the right of way still exists.

Some of these facilities are simple pathways while others are steep enough to require stairways. An added benefit is in the event of an emergency, these facilities can serve as evacuation routes.

## POINTS OF INTEREST

The funded projects connect a variety of locations in the four communities although they typically traverse residential areas and connect with adjacent commercial districts or schools.

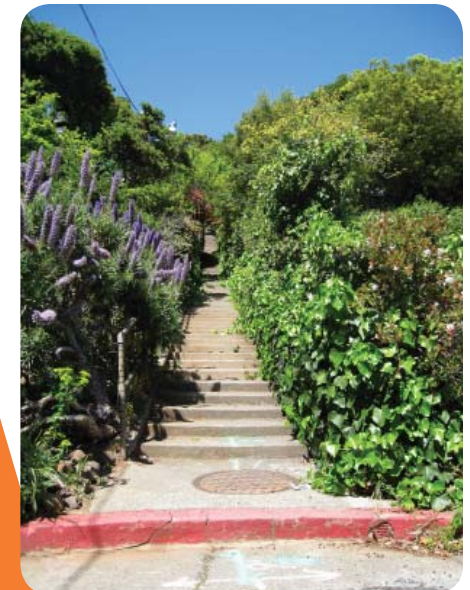
