

Bicycle Repair / Training

Program Number: RES-2

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Provide grant funding to a local organization, firm, or institutions to develop a series of bicycle repair/training classes. Potential recipients include non-profits and local bicycle shops. Grant funding will be used to hire additional training staff, promote the program, offer repair classes, expand number of youth being trained in "build-a-bike" programs, increase the number of bicycles rebuilt, and publicize the sale of these bicycles. Grant recipients will provide a detailed budget for how the moneys will be spent, and quantify the additional training, students, and number of bicycles to be rebuilt and sold through this grant.

Community Walking Maps

Program Number: RES-4

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

This program consists of developing, printing, and distributing new Maps of existing and potential walkways, stairs, bikeways, and other facilities, aimed at encouraging more local trips by foot or bicycle. These maps would include transit stops to show how people can walk or bicycle to transit. Grant funds may be used to pay for staff time, printing, materials, distribution, services, graphics, and other items.

Maps for Directional Use

Program Number: RES-8

PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

Maps depicting bicycling routes, on both a local and countywide level, will be funded through this program. This may include updates and additional copies of existing maps that would be made available for free or subsidized to the public, and/or new maps focused on specific areas or modes of travel (such as access to transit). The map program will be coordinated with existing and proposed bikeway guide signs; could be beneficially supplemented with references to educational kiosks in public locations where bicycle riders enter and exit transit, where they'd likely seek out directions if they are new to the routes, and where cyclists currently tend to gather.
